Services Offered

- Provide primary and behavioral health care.
- Non-emergency medical services: cold, flu, chronic illness treatment, immunizations (immunizations will require additional consent).
- Non-threatening injury: stitches, splints, etc.
- Sports physicals
- Behavioral Health (on-site tele-health & referral)
- Substance abuse assistance (on-site tele-health & referral)
- Dental pain (referral)
- Relationship building to promote healthy eating and activity.

Services **Not** Offered

QSHWC will not prescribe or dispense contraceptives or make referrals for abortions. MLCHC's operational practices prohibit abortion referrals at all clinic sites.
